## Value of Scholarship Grant

The Endeavour Scholarship
Grant is based on the
number of ECTS as indicated
on the Unconditional Letter
of Acceptance provided by
the deadline.





#### This means that:

- For qualifications issued by local institutions, the amount to be paid is €58 for every ECTS achieved.
- For qualifications issued by foreign universities, the amount to be paid is €100 for every ECTS achieved.





After finalising the Scholarship Grant Agreement, the office will initiate the process to reimburse you with the first 30% of the amount entitled for. Payments are expected to start being processed as from February.





Where qualifications are issued by a local university/institution: Awardees shall be entitled for the first 30% of the amount as follows:

No. of ECTS	Full Entitlement (€58 for each ECTS)	30% to be disbursed upfront (1st payment)
60 ECTS	€3,480	€1,044
90 ECTS	€5,220	€1,566
120 ECTS	€6,960	€2,088





Where qualifications are issued by a foreign university/institution: Awardees shall be entitled for the first 30% of the amount as follows:

No. of ECTS	Full Entitlement (€100 per each ECTS)	30% to be disbursed upfront (1st payment)
60 ECTS	€ 6,000	€1,800
90 ECTS	€ 9,000	€2,700
120 ECTS	€12,000	€3,600





Interim payments will be paid during your studies according to the number of ECTS achieved. Payments will only be processed after proof of ECTS achieved has been received. Your institution is to confirm the number of the ECTS achieved including the code and title of module directly via e-mail.





The last 5% of the Endeavour Grant will be paid following receipt of all the final documents.





### Additional Allowances:

Allowances are going to be paid every quarter on pro rata basis.

If your final transcript shows that completion date is earlier than the one shown on your unconditional letter of acceptance, then the office has to review your allowances. This applies also for those who travelled to their university after the start date of their course as shown on the unconditional letter of acceptance.

All allowances are subject to the documentation as requested in Section 12 of the Endeavour Regulations.





Type of Allowance – Section 12	
Study Abroad Allowance	For visits of one month or more, the allowances will be calculated pro-rata (€2,500). For visits of less than one month, the €200 per visit will apply.
Children Allowance for children under 16yrs	€1,170 p.a. for 1 <sup>st</sup> Child and €700 p.a. for any other child
Gozo Allowance	€1,050 p.a.
CRPD Holders	€2,000 p.a.





## Request for Progress Report

Every six months, the Scholarship awardees shall ask for a short statement in writing which needs to be submitted to the Endeavour Office by their faculty supervisor confirming their progress and attendance (where applicable). Failure on the part of the Scholarship Awardee to submit such statement/s may lead to suspension of payments of further instalments of the Amount awarded.





Please choose research which is feasible and that could be sustainable, not dependant on other features/factors/circumstances beyond your control.





#### **AMENDMENTS**

- It is of utmost importance that if any issues or mishaps arise during your studies, you are to inform the office immediately to guide you accordingly.
- Certain cases have to be forwarded for the consideration of the Endeavour Board, therefore for Example, if you foresee that an extension of studies is required, you have to write a request to the Endeavour Board through our office and then the formal approval from your university is also required.
- Formal amendments to your agreement will be issued once there is a change in any of the information entered on your agreement.
- Inform this office if you change your e-mail address since we will be communicating with you mostly via e-mails.
- Your cooperation is much appreciated.


