

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1. Introduction

1.1 Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme is intended to support student pursuing a course in Veterinary Studies leading to (MQF Level 7) abroad leading to registration of a Veterinary Surgeon as determined by the board of Veterinary Surgeons.

2. General Regulations

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

2.1 The Ministry of Education and Employment is committed to enhance and widen the existing system of scholarships to assist more students and ease the financial burden incurred especially in cases when they are compelled to follow their studies abroad.

The need has long been felt to aid and assist students following courses in Veterinary Medicine. Courses leading to course in Veterinary Studies leading to (MQF Level 7) are to date not available locally.

Since in some countries, you can study veterinary medicine at undergraduate level, an anomaly was created in our system of present scholarship schemes which rendered undergraduate applicants ineligible for funding covering tuition/bench fees.

The launch of this new scholarship scheme will enable students following the course for Course in Veterinary (MQF Level 7) to apply and be awarded a more rewarding financial package covering the duration of the whole course until completion and ultimately graduating in Veterinary Medicine at a recognized Institution and with level 7 certification of the Malta Qualification Framework.

3. Definitions

- 3.1. Academic Record shall mean an official document issue by a Recognized Institution. The document shall show the marks/grades obtained by the Applicant and where it is the norm, the final grade/classification, inculding a breakdown of credits.
- 3.2 Agreement shall mean legally binding document to be signed by the Scholarship Awardee as beneficiary of the Scholarship and the MEDE (as defined in 3.19). These Regulations shall be construed as forming part of the Agreement. The Agreement has to be signed by not later than 3 months after the commencement of studies or the publication of rankings, whichever comes last unless otherwise justified. The monetary amounts shown in the Agreement shall be disbursed only if the proper documentation (invoices, receipts and any bank statements) is submitted and verified for eligibility and correctness. In the event of any inconsistency or discrepancy between the Agreement and these Regulations, these Regulations shall prevail in all cases and the Agreement shall be amended to the extent of the discrepancy or inconsistency with these Regulations.
- 3.3 Appeals Board shall mean the Scholarship Appeals Board appointed by the Minister of Education and Employment entrusted with assessing and delivering final decisions in respect of petitions submitted by Applicants contesting decisions taken by the VSS Board and/or the MEDE administrator of the Scheme on the interpretation of these Regulations. Any decision taken by the Appeals Board shall be regarded as final and irrevocable for all and purposes of the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme.
- 3.4 Applicant shall mean a person who submits a scholarship application.
- 3.5 Award shall refer to the title of certification of learning achieved through courses which do not have the required number of credits at the specific MQF (as defined in 3.20) Level to be considered as a Qualification.
- 3.6 Awardee shall mean a person who is awarded a scholarship.

- 3.7 Awarding Body refers to an Educational Institution recognized by the NCFHE (as defined in 3.22) whose purpose is to award accredited qualifications.
- 3.8 Certificate of Award or Qualification shall mean the official Result Transcript/Certificate indicating the successful completion of the Programme of Study issued by the Recognised or Training Institution.
- 3.9 Closing of the Scheme shall mean the deadline for the submission of applications.
- 3.10 Commencement Date of Scholarship shall mean the date as specified on the ULD (as defined in 3.29) being the start date of the programme/course on which payment to Awardee commences.
- 3.11 Completion Date shall mean the date when the programme/course is successfully completed and the final result is published.
- 3.12 Course Duration is to be established by the Recognised or Training Institution. When it does not cover whole months, the funds disbursed will be calculated pro rata to the nearest month. For further definition of how month is calculated, please consult Clause 3.23 of these Regulations.
- 3.13 ECTS shall mean European Credit Transfer System.
- 3.14 ECVET shall mean European Credits in Vocational Education and Training.
- 3.15 End Date shall mean the date as specified on the ULA or the date specified on the Transcript as issued by the Recognised or Training Institution whichever date is the earliest. Payments are calculated to cover the period from the Commencement Date to the End Date.
- 3.16 Veterinary Studies Scholarships' Scheme (VSSS) shall mean, for the purposes of these Regulations and the Agreement, a Scholarship scheme administered by the Students' Maintenance Grants' & Scholarships Unit within the MEDE. The scheme is locally financed.
- 3.17 Veterinary Scholarships' Scheme Board shall mean a Board appointed by the Minister responsible for Education and Employment. This Board shall be entrusted with the evaluation and ranking of Applicants for the awarding of Scholarships and overseeing of the scheme.
- 3.18 ISCED shall mean International Standard Classification of Education.
- 3.19 MEDE shall mean the Ministry for Education and Employment.
- 3.20 MGUS: The Malta Government Undergraduate Scheme (MGUS) 2019/20 aims at providing more opportunities to further the choice of undergraduate degrees/ qualifications up to MQF Level 6 and including Bachelor Degrees and vocational qualifications, classified at Level 6 or equivalent under the Malta Qualification Framework (MQF).
- 3.21 MQF- Malta Qualifications Framework shall act as a translation device to make national qualifications more readable across Europe, promoting workers' and learners' mobility between countries and facilitating lifelong learning.
- 3.22 MQRIC shall mean Malta Qualifications Regulation Recognition Information Centre within the National Commission for Further and Higher Education.
- 3.23 NCFHE shall mean National Commission for Further and Higher Education.
- 3.24 Per Annum shall mean twelve(12) calendar months. This means that when a course is of a duration of for example nine (9) calendar months, the grant shall be awarded pro rata over that number of months. For avoidance of doubt in calculating, the meaning of a month the Awardee must spend more than fifteen (15) consecutive days in the study programme in order to be eligible for funds covering a month.
- 3.24 Qualification shall mean a certificate issued by a Recognized Institution, which confirms the acquisition of the required number of credits making up the Programme of Study at the respective MQF Level as specified by the Referencing Report 2016.
- 3.25 Recognised Institution shall mean an awarding body recognized by the competent

authorities in the country where the institution is registered and recognized by NCHFE (in the case of foreign institutions) or locally accredited by NCHFE. Transcript shall have the same meaning as Academic Record.

- 3.26 Training Institution shall mean the organization offering the study programme identified by the Applicant.
- 3.28 Tuition Fees shall mean enrolment, administration, registration and/or examination fees charged by a Recognised or Training Institution. Tuition Fees covered shall be those charged directly by a Recognised or Training Institution as approved by the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board. Any subsequent increase in Tuition Fees cannot be claimed by the Awardee or the Recognised or Training Institution if not included in the ULA/official document from the relative Institution.
- 3.29 Unconditional Letter of Acceptance (ULA) shall mean an official letter issued to the Applicant by the Registrar or a delegated high authority of the Recognised Institution or Training Institution, which shall have the following details:
 - + A clear statement by the Training Institution that is unconditionally accepting the Applicant to follow a programme of study.
 - + The Commencement Date of studies. Where the exact date is not specified, this is taken as the last day of the month mentioned on the ULA.
 - + The End Date of studies. Where the exact date is not specified, this is taken as the first day of the month mentioned in the ULA.
 - Modality of study (that is whether it is distance learning or part time or full time studies);
 - + The number of Credits/number of ECTS pertaining to the programme of study.
 - + The Tuition Fee (if applicable) shall be indicated on the ULA or another official document issued by the relative university. Applicant shall note that the Agreement to be signed at a later stage (should he/she be awarded a Scholarship) shall include only the information printed on the ULA/official document provided by the deadline. MEDE shall not accept any revisions in Tuition Fees other than those, which reflect the information and/or data provided by the ULA submitted by Friday 4 September 2020, noon local time.
 - + It is the duty of the Applicant to ensure that when he/she chooses a Recognised or Training Institution, this institution is in a position to issue such a ULA and/or other official document with all the above details. The ULA must be produced before the signing of the Scholarship Agreement.
 - + No additional costs other than those stated in the ULA/other official documents presented by date of signing of agreement, shall be considered for the purpose of Agreement.

4. Eligibility

4.1 In order to apply for a Scholarship, under the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme, by the closing date of the Scheme, an applicant shall:

4.1.1

- a. Be a Maltese citizen who has been residing in Malta for the past five (5) years. Provided that a Maltese citizen who has been residing outside Malta for study, health or work purposes it is not excluded or
- Be Maltese Citizen who is an employed or self-employed person in Malta; or
- c. Be a national of an EU/EEA state or a family member of such EU/EEA national (as defined SL460.17 and in SL217.04 respectively for EU and EFA nationals), provided that such person has obtained permanent residence in Malta in accordance with SL460.17 and in SL217.04 respectively for EU and EEA nationals; or
- d. Be a national of an EU/EEA state who is in Malta exercising his/her treaty rights as an employee, self-employed person or person retaining such status in accordance with SL460.17; or
- e. Be third country national that has been granted long term residence status under SL217.05; or
- f. Be in possession of a residence document issued in terms of the Residence Status of United Kingdom Nationals and their Family Members in Malta in accordance with the Agreement on the Withdrawal of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland from the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community Regulations

AND

g. Be already in a programme of Veterinary Studies leading to MQF Level 7 as long as the end date of studies is in 2021 or after. The applicant is still obliged to provide a ULA

OR

4.1.2 Be applying to follow a Course in Veterinary Medicine (MQF level 7).

AND

4.1.3 Applicants shall start their studies by 31st December 2020 or are already enrolled in the course and currently undergoing their studies;

AND

4.1.4 Applicants must have completed their term of compulsory education.

AND

- 4.1.5 Applicants must have resided in Malta for a period of not less than five (5) consecutive years immediately prior to the commencement of this course of studies.
- 4.2 The closing date of application including the ULA for those who already started their course and the required attachments as listed in clause 7.1 shall be submitted by 24th July 2020 at noon (Local Time).
- 4.3 Students who have already attained another qualification including but not only at MQF Level 6, may still apply under the scheme. Students who have graduated with an MQF Level 7 qualification or higher may still apply under this scheme provided that they have not benefited from another scholarship offered for post graduate studies by the Ministry for Education and Employment within the last 10 years from the date of launch of this scheme.

- 4.4 Applicants in possession of other EU (or a combination of both) public grants or national/EU/ Commonwealth (or a combination) scholarship for the same course or programme shall be deemed ineligible under the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme if not notified and approved by the Board. Any scholarships or other supplementary grants awarded to the Scholarship Awardee shall be notified to and approved by the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board, whether such are awarded to the Applicant prior to the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme or throughout the duration of the Scholarship Awardee had, at any point in time whether prior to the award of the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme grant, or after such award, is in receipt of any national/ EU public grant or national/EU scholarship, the Scholarship Awardee shall be liable to refund all the amount/s up to then paid to him/her or on his/her behalf in full, and this without prejudice to any other legal action which may be taken in his/her regard.
- 4.5 Applicants in possession of other national EU (or a combination of both) public grants or national EU/Commonwealth (or a combination) scholarships for a different course or programme, have to complete the first course and fulfil all the contractual obligations before the grant of a second scholarship is awarded.
- 4.6 Applicants shall become ineligible for a Scholarship if s/he is in breach of any part of the Regulations.

5. Choice Of Study Programme

- 5.1. Awards are tenable at any Recognised or Training institution for the Course in Veterinary Medicine leading to MQF Level 7 only.
- 5.2. It is the responsibility of Applicants, applying for qualifications awarded by foreign Recognised Institutions to produce an evaluation report on comparability of qualifications issued by the Malta Qualifications Recognition Information Centre (MQRIC) within the National Commission for Further and Higher Education (NCFHE). A copy of the said report issued by the MQRIC, shall be attached to the application, unless for those Universities/Institutes provided in the same application. Where required, the original document must be presented at the interview. Applicants who are required to obtain NCFHE evaluation but who are still not in possession of this report may still apply, if they submit a copy of the report of the report to the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board by Friday 4th September 2020, noon, local time.

6. Administration Of The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme

6.1 The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme is administered by the Scholarships Unit within the Ministry for Education and Employment. The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board is responsible for overseeing the scheme.

7. Application Forms

- 7.1 In line with government policy and to enhance the Scholarships Unit environmental social responsibility ONLY online applications are accepted. Applicants are invited to apply using the appropriate online. Electronic Application on: www. myscholarship.gov.mt It is the responsibility of the Applicants to ensure that their Application is successfully submitted, to keep a printed copy of the Application Form and to print a copy of the electronically generated acknowledgment. This shall be the Applicants' proof that an Application is submitted successfully online, and on time.
- 7.2 It is Imperative to note that the final verification of submission of Application will be based on the official systems logs.

The below supporting documents must be uploaded with the application: -

- + A copy of Curriculum Vitae clearly stating all qualifications attained by applicant
- + A copy of the ULA
- + A copy of the residence permit (where applicable)
- + A copy of the MQRIC evaluation report
- + A motivational statement
- + 500 word abstract focussing on the impact your studies will have on the Vetinary field in Malta.
- + Progress report and academic transcript (if any)
- + Reference letter (See Appendix)
- 7.3 The online application shall also include:
 - + one (1) copy of the letter of Unconditional Letter of Acceptance from the recognised institution applied for (if available at the time of application);
 - + any other documentation which may assist the VSS Board to assess better the applicant's merit.
- 7.4 The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board shall penalize Applicants who fail to submit the required documents with the Application Form will be deemed ineligible.
- 7.5 The applications deadline is 24 July at noon.
- 7.6 Late applications shall not be considered by the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board .
- 7.7 Applicants are to ensure that they apply online by the stipulated deadline. The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board and the Scholarships' Appeals' Board shall not consider any petitions stating that the Application Form was submitted without tangible proof as evidence.

8. Eligibility, Selection Process and Process and Procedure

- 8.1 The Ministry for Education and Employment has appointed the Vetinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board to conduct the process of selection. This Board shall be responsible for all matters concerning selection according to preestablished criteria identified in Clause 9 and determination of appropriate awards according to the Regulations.
- 8.2 Eligible Applicants may be called for an interview. It is the responsibility

of the Applicant to make sure to be available on the date and time communicated to him/her for the interview. No alternative arrangements shall be made to the date and time of the interview unless there are exceptional circumstances (supported by written proof) that merits the change of such date and time. The exceptional circumstances shall be examined, and such alternative date and time may be agreed to by the Board's discretion. Any interviews are expected to be scheduled within 6 weeks from the closing date of the call for applications and be held during weekdays from Monday to Friday between 8.30a.m. and 6.30p.m.

- 8.3 In the case of applicants who are unable to attend on the given date and time for the interview due to being abroad, such interviews shall take place remotely via online applications, only at the given date and time. The FSS Board does not assume any responsibility if the interview is not carried out properly due to any technical reason. In exceptional cases, an alternative date for interview may be given by the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board depending on the circumstances, which led to the circumstances.
- 8.4 The Selection process is expected to take not more than 12 weeks from the closing date of the call for applications.

9. Selection Criteria

Applications are considered based on the following selection criteria:

- + The personal goals in the local context.
- + The impact your studies will have on the Veterinary field in Malta.
- + Academic record and review of submitted documentation.
- + Previous work experience in the area of specialisation applying for and/ or work with voluntary organisations.

10. Appeals

- 10.1 The Ministry for Education and Employment has also appointed an Appeals Board to deal with objections raised by Applicants after they are informed in writing of the decisions of the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board.
- 10.2 If an applicant disagrees with the Veterinary Scholarship Selection Board (VSSB) or any other procedure under these Regulations, the Applicant may present a petition on email: scholarshipsappeals.mede@gov.mt to the Appeals Board within six (6) working days from the date of the letter sent by the VSSB or the Administrator communicates the decision/s to the Applicant in writing through registered mail.
- 10.3 The Appeals Board shall only address appeals from decisions of the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board on matters related to procedure or interpretation of the Regulations in terms of eligibility, awards, and other decisions related to the granting of a Scholarship. Under no circumstances shall the Appeals Board alter the Regulations, the score of the Applicants derived from interviews by the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board or change the ranking of an Applicant as a result of such score.
- 10.4 The decision of the Appeals Board is final and conclusive.

11. Value Of Awards And Payments

11.1 For programmes provided by the Recognised or Training Institution/Awarding Body the Scholarship grant shall ONLY cover tuition fees according to the funding provided for the entire duration of the study programme up to a maximum value indicated in the ULA.

VETERINARY STUDIES SCHOLARSHIPS SCHEME: MAXIMUM FUNDING FOR 5 YEARS ON TUITION FEES ONLY

For the purpose of this scheme no other commencement date prior to 2016 will be accepted.

- 11.2 Any additional fees incurred by the Awardee are not considered to be part of this scholarship.Moreover payment schedules will be defined in the grant agreement.
- 11.3 Payment for tuition fees must be affected by the Awardee. Awardee must present the invoice/s, receipts and bank statement (as applicable) and as stipulated in the agreement signed with the Scholarships Unit. Payment under this Scheme for a tuition fees does not necessarily cover all fees and depends on the capping indicated in the agreement signed with this office.
- 11.4 The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board has to be informed immediately if a student has requested an extension for completion of studies and/doing an additional year or shall be repeating a year of studies. This information must be addressed to the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board supported by documentation from the relative Institution. During the extension period, no funds will be further allocated. During an additional/repeating year, no additional fees will be covered from the scholarships scheme.

12. General Conditions Of Award

12.1 The general conditions in this section apply to all Applicants under the scheme and to all Scholarship Awardees.

ADDITIONAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS/GRANTS

- 12.2 Additional Scholarship awards or additional grants for the same course of programme of studies must be declared before signing the agreement with this office. All declarations require approval from the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board. Any unapproved additional Scholarship awards or additional grants of over and above granted by the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme for the same course or programme shall be deemed to be in the breach of the agreement. As a result, cancellation of award and refund of all funds through the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board. The Board considers this as a fraud and may proceed with a criminal liability suit against such Awardees.
- 12.2.1 When a Supplementary Scholarship award or Supplementary Grant covers part of the Tuition Fee, then Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme shall cover the remaining part of the Tuition Fee to the capping declared. The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board may also decide to award payment of the stipends.
- 12.2.2 Stipend is being granted from MGUS.

PROVISIONAL AWARD STAGE

- 12.3 Applicants will be notified of their award by the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board.
- 12.4 The Awardees shall be given a draft agreement that stipulates the terms and conditions of such Award. The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board reserves the right to review and cancel the provisional award if new information reveals any change in information or conditions or conditions, which renders the provisional Awardees ineligible for the Scholarship Award.
- 12.5 The Awardees shall conclude and sign the Agreement by not later than three (3) months after the commencement of studies or the publication of awards, whichever comes last unless otherwise justified. As part of the signing of Agreement, the Awardees shall be required to fill in several forms, including, TR/S-9, the declaration of Confidentiality, and other forms that may be communicated by the MEDE. Awardees following full time studies and in receipt of stipends may also be required to provide further documentation including but not only the Employment History Form/its equivalent from the country of stay during studies, periodically.
- 12.6 Should any conflict arise between the interpretation of clauses in the Regulations and the Agreement the Regulations shall prevail.
- 12.7 The Awardees shall be expected to start their study programme by 31st December 2020
- 12.8 The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board reserves the right to publish the names of Applicants selected for Scholarships. In applying for an award, the Applicants give consent for such publication in the event that their application is successful.

CONTRACTED AWARD STAGE

- 12.9 The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board reserves the right to publish the names of Scholarship Awardees on the website <u>www.myscholarship.gov.mt</u>
- 12.10 Scholarship can only finance the qualification for which the Awardee initially applied for Scholarship cannot be used to finance any other qualification other than that which the scholarship was awarded for.

- 12.11 Awardees cannot engage themselves in other programmes of studies that the one being sponsored for under this scheme during the time of the scholarship.
- 12.12 The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme shall not seek to obtain any rights in intellectual property owned by the Awarding Body and/or the Awardee.
- 12.13 On award of a scholarship, the MEDE shall make information obtained available to public authorities for accountability purposes.
- 12.14 Awardees who are found to have given false information or who have in any manner withheld information that would have influenced the awarding of the Scholarship and/or any grants in accordance with these Regulations, shall be immediately disqualified and shall be asked to reimburse any expenses and money granted to them or on their behalf. The Board may proceed with a criminal liability suit, without prejudice to any civil action for damages, against such Awardees.

PROGRESS AND COMPLETION

- 12.15 Awardees shall ask their supervisor to submit directly to Schoalrships Unit a short statement confirming progress and attendance of the Awardee, every six (6) months, Failure to receive this information would lead to a halt in payments of further instalments for the Scholarship. Generic Email VETs
- 12.16 On completion of the studies, the final report as well as a copy of the Transcript and/or the Official Certificate indicating the successful completion of Programme of Study, shall be submitted to the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board within two (2) months from the award of the qualifications.
- 12.17 Awardees shall write a minimum of one (1) article on their work/studies in the Maltese public media within sixty (60) days of their graduation, during which they publicly acknowledge that the training programme / degree was carried out following the award of Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme financed by the Government of Malta. A link and/or hard copy of this article is to be sent to the relevant authority.
- 12.18 By accepting a Scholarship the Awardees shall be accepting that MEDE shall have the right to make public all publications by Scholarships Awardees, if any. This includes any publication arising from the thesis sent in electronic format to the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Office. The Awardee is expected to submit such publications within (30) days of being made public to be uploaded on the Scholarship Unit Portal. Thesis on a pendrive or upload in onedrive/We transfer etc
- 12.19 During the last year of studies, 50% of the final payments of tuition fees will not be credited until awardee presents to this office the certification requested under 12.16.

13. Termination Prior To Completion Of Programme

- 13.1 Scholarship Awardees who for any reason discontinue their studies shall inform the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board in writing immediately.
- 13.2 The FSS Board shall on thirty (30) days written notice the award if-
 - + The applicant's progress is deemed unsatisfactory by the Recognised Institution;
 - + The Applicant discontinues the studies; and /or
 - + The Applicant is in breach of any provision of these regulations, and does not remedy the breach within thirsty (30days of receipt of written notice requiring him/her to do so.
- 13.3 When an awardee has the Scholarship award terminated under conditions stipulated in Clause 13.2 the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board shall determine the amount to be reimbursed. The refund, if any, has to be made within three (3) months of failing the course or failing to complete the

course of studies as the case may be . The Scholarships Unit reserves the right to take legal action to recoup the funds. Awardees may seek an agreement with this Unit regarding payment by instalments.

13.4 Awardees shall not be deemed to be in breach of these regulations ONLY in case of serious illness and demise of the Awardee. No legal action shall be taken against the heirs of the Awardee in Case of demise. In case of serious illness, the Awardee needs to provide medical certificates and testimonials to the Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board. Thus, awardees who cannot pursue further studies due to serious illness might still be required to refund the funds received or part thereof, at the discretion of Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board.

In all cases of discontinue if studies before completion, the Scholarship Awardee shall provide justifiable explanation as to why the course was not completed or why the Scholarship Awardee failed to obtain the qualification. Documented evidence, medical certificates and testimonials must accompany each claim. The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board shall in no way be bound to waiver all claims put forward. The Veterinary Studies Scholarships Scheme Board reserves the right to appoint its own expert, be it medical or otherwise, to advise and assess the case of the claimant.

14. Publicity Obligations

14.1 All publications arising from the programme, if any being sponsored by this scheme, shall reflect the following acknowledgment on the first pages if the publication: "The research work disclosed in the publication is funded by the Veterinary Sciences Scholarship's Scheme – Ministry for Education and Employment".
