Sports Medicine, Exercise and Health MSc. - Robert Mallia

I have been in the physiotherapy world for the past 10 years, five of them as a professional. Throughout this journey, I have been exposed to different work settings, ranging from acute medical wards, orthopaedic outpatients, various sport disciplines, musculoskeletal and physiotherapy in mental health amongst other settings. Each of these opportunities granted me invaluable experience as a developing and growing physiotherapist. However, it was when I was working in an orthopaedic, musculoskeletal and sports settings that always felt the most fruitful from a personal point of view.
